## How does the Seminary realize its vision?

### 1 Sacred Knowledge (*‘Ilm*)

An integrated program of practice through the gradual introduction of a daily schedule of devotional worship along with collective remembrance sessions.

### 3 Fellowship (*Suhba*)

A blend of in-person fellowship and online fellowship to learn together and to find spiritual strength and solace in one another.

### 4 Applied Learning

Monthly seminars on eight practical themes — personal development, family, politics, arts and technology, for example — that apply Islam’s rational and spiritual principles to specific life challenges.
